
# The First South Carolinians



### I. How did 1<sup>st</sup> humans get to SC?

- A. Land Bridge Theory- During ICE AGE, groups of people from Asia came over the Bearing Sea
  - 1. Why? hunting large migratory animals
  - 2. When? 40,000 years ago
  - 3. came into SC 15,000 years ago.
  - 4. People in this migration are called "Clovis People"
- B. Topper Site:
  - 1. In 2004, ancient tools found in Allendale County, SC
  - 2. these tools appear to be 50,000 years older than the oldest Clovis tools
  - 3. artifacts from this site challenge our ideas about the first Americans.


#### II. Prehistoric periods in SC

- A. Historians have categories for prehistoric periods, based on artifacts that have been discovered.
  - 1. Pre-projectile period
    - a. 13,000-9,000 B.C. (ice age in SC)
    - b. Big Game hunting
    - c. Scrapers, Choppers used as tools
    - d. Temporary camps



### II. Prehistoric people in SC


- 2. Paleo Indian Period
  - a. 9000 BC-8000 BC (end of Ice Age)
  - b. Hunting smaller game
  - c. Small stone tools and spear points
  - d. campsites
- 3. Archaic Period
  - a. 8000-1000 BC
  - b. Hunting and Gathering
  - c. Thick bowls, Ground stone axes, arrow heads, woven baskets
  - d. Semi-permanent dwellings



### II. Prehistoric people in SC

- 4. Woodland period
  - a. 1000 BC-1150 AD
  - b. Hunting, gathering, gardening
  - c. Small villages, <u>burial mounds</u>, small arrowheads, pottery
- 5. Mississippian period
  - a. 1150-1550 AD
  - b. Hunting, gathering, farming
  - c. Large villages, temple mounds, decorated pottery, arrowheads

### II. Prehistoric people in SC

- 6. Historic Period
  - a. 1550- Forward
  - b. Hunting, Gathering, Farming, TRADING
  - c. Larger Villages, Decorated pottery FIRST CONTACT WITH EUROPEANS!
  - d. Europeans began documenting natives in written form

### III. 4 distinct cultural groups living in SC

#### A. Siouan

- 1. Lived in NORTH CENTRAL and PEEDEE region of SC
- 2. Included Catawba, Cheraw, Peedee tribes

#### B. Iroquoian

- 1. lived in Northwestern SC
- 2. Included the Cherokee tribe

### III. 4 distinct cultural groups living in SC

#### C. Algonquian

- 1. Lived along the Savannah River
- 2. Included Saluda, Yuchi and Savannah tribes

#### D. Muskogean

- 1. lived along atlantic coast, south of Winyah Bay
- 2. Included Cusabo, Kiawah, and Yamasee

#### IV. eastern woodlands tribes:

- A. Included all tribes from Mississippi River to Atlantic Ocean
- B. Mostly dwelled in wooded areas
- C. Included both COASTAL and INLAND tribes
- D. Hunting, Gathering, Farming Fishing
- E. Tribes often formed political CONFEDERACIES with each other
- F. Each tribe had Distict LANGUAGES and CUSTOMS
- G. Women: Farmed Men: Hunted/Fought
- H. Both Men and women had roles in Govt

#### V. SC Tribes

- A. Pre-European Native Population IN SC: 17,000-30,000 and over 50 tribes!
- B. By 1715, Native Population was 7,500 because of Euro. Diseases
- C. Many tribes disappeared or joined with larger tribes
- D. Most important tribes:
  - 1. Cherokee
    - a. Cherokee means "people of different speech" or "outsiders"
    - b. Cherokee lived in SC, NC, TN, VA, WV, KY, GA, AL
    - c. In SC, mostly in BLUE RIDGE/PIEDMONT
    - d. Enemies of the Catawba
    - e. Governed by a "Red Chief" and a "white chief" and a council
